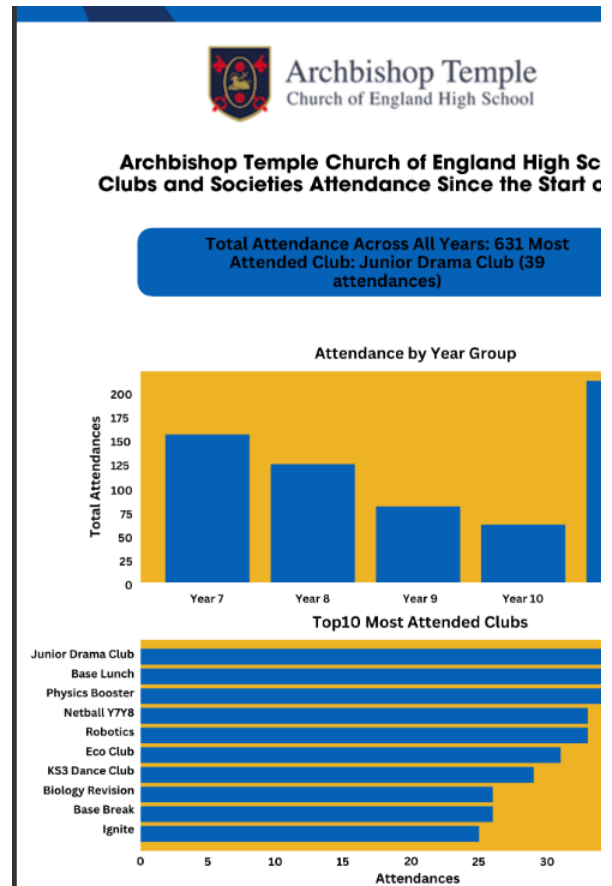
Unlocking Potential Beyond the Classroom: The Power of Extra-Curricular Involvement

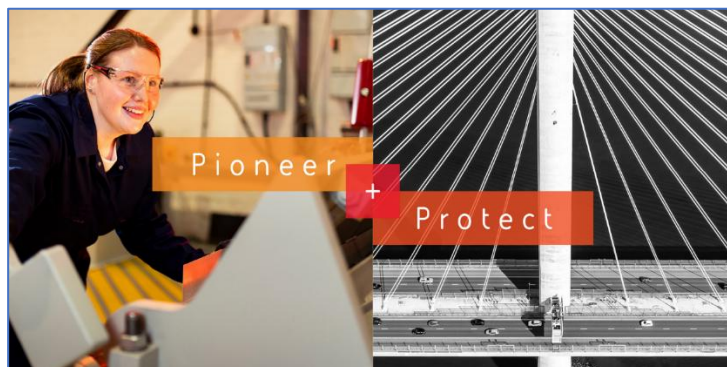


