			• Pupils and teachers can take books and other shared resources home, although unnecessary sharing will be avoided by setting homework on Firefly.		
			• With up to 1 in 3 people with COVID-19 not displaying any symptoms, rapid testing remains a vital tool. The twice weekly regular testing habit will continue to be recommended and results reported on <u>GOV.UK</u> .		
			• Anyone who tests positive using an LFD test will be asked to take a confirmatory follow-up PCR test. It remains essential that anyone who gets a positive LFD result self-isolates immediately for 10 days. Pupils and fully vaccinated adults are not required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19 or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19. It is recommended		

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			close contacts take a PCR test although there is no requirement to self-isolate whilst waiting the result.			
			<ul> <li>Individuals who test negative from the LFD will not need to isolate or take a confirmatory test.</li> </ul>			
			• Test kits will be provided to all schools with refreshed guidance, test kits and PPE prior to the start of the Autumn Term to enable Asymptomatic Test Sites to be set- up.			
			• A staggered start will be in place for all pupils consenting to testing, details to be emailed separately. Those not consenting will only come back to school on the full return of their year group.			
			• Staff will continue to test twice weekly and pupils will have two tests initially. If they then develop symptoms they will be required to arrange for a PCR test and isolate until the results are known and follow government guidance. School will no longer be responsible for tracing close contacts of those who test positive for Covid-19; close contacts will be identified via NHS Test and Trace.

			• Staff showing symptoms are sent home and reminded to test and self-isolate, following current government guidance for staying at home.			
			• If a pupil displays symptoms they will not be permitted to remain in school. Their parent/carer etc will be required to take them home. Where this is not immediately possible, the pupil will be placed in a separate room until they can be collected, whilst being mindful of individual pupils' needs.			
			• PPE must be worn by staff caring for the child while they await collection if a distance of 2 metres cannot be maintained.			

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			• PPE is freely available by contacting either the finance or site teams.		
			• Ideally, a window will be opened in the room for increased ventilation.		
			• If it is not possible to isolate the pupil e.g. if it causes them undue distress or they need to remain under adult observation, an assessment will be carried out to see whether it is sufficient to move them to an area which is at least 2 metres away from others.		
			<ul> <li>If an individual (adult or child) showing COVID-19 symptoms, needs to use the bathroom while waiting to go home, they will use a separate bathroom if possible. The bathroom will then be cleaned and disinfected before being used by anyone else.</li> </ul>
