Staying Safe Online

It has been reported that Sexting messages including images and text have dramatically increased during the pandemic. "Data from safeguarding app <u>SafeToNet</u> found that 'sexts' typed out by children in the UK rose 183% during lockdown – with a 55% rise in inappropriate messages drafted during normal school hours."

It is our goal here at Archbishop Temple School to create resilient users of technology, to do this we need to provide them with all the information they need to not only stay safe online, but also to be able to know what to do if things go wrong.

Talking to children about issues and what they do online is key to helping to keep them safe, especially when they are being gifted new mobile technology. It is a very worrying statistic that children are increasingly involved in taking and sharing inappropriate images of themselves. This is not only illegal but can lead to the ultimate consequence of one of these images out there on the Internet. Reminding young people about the consequence of actions could help prevent this from happening in the first place.



Discord (Age 12+)

Apple rate Discord – as 12+ and Google Play rate Discord as Teen.

The Apple and Paly stores description of this App as being 'a place to talk'.

Discord is the only crossplatform voice and text chat app designed specifically for gamers.

With the IOS app users can stay connected to all Discord voice and text channels even when AFK (Away From Keyboard).

Discord provides anonymity and privacy for communications, this does mean that it is vulnerable to the users who may use it for hostile or predatory behaviour and abuse whilst in chats.
