Bags to School

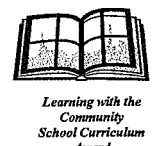
Please find attached a Bags to School bag. The collection is tomorrow, so we need all bags back to school first thing in the morning.

We break up on Wednesday July 19th at 1.30pm.

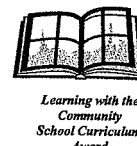
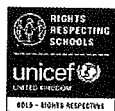

Please find below details of a competition that you may be interested in. It came from The Herald newspaper in Penrith.

All entries must be on a farming theme, whether it is a farmer at work, an agricultural landscape, machinery, farm animals or any other agricultural topic.

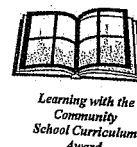

The winner of the 16 and under competition will receive a Junior Account with an opening balance of £50 from Penrith Building Society, and a set of greetings cards featuring their image, produced by McKane's Printers, Penrith.
