Reading Evening

All children should be doing some reading aloud to parents\grandparents each week. This helps us to

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check for fluency and to discuss vocabulary whilst developing your child's comprehension skills (understanding of what they are reading). It also gives your child the message that you value their reading and will give them your time to read.

Please can you make sure you put your order in for school lunch. Mrs Dowes spends a lot of time each day chasing up dinner orders so that we don't have wasted food and costs to school.
