Kilombero Rice

As part of our work as a Fair-trade school, we are completing the 90kg Kilombero rice challenge. 90kg is the amount of rice a farmer in Malawi has to sell to provide a sustainable income and afford to send a child to secondary school for a year. We have links to MOET school in Malawi. Headteacher Patterson came to visit us a few years ago. He has set up a primary school for children who have been orphaned. Many of the children in his school are unable to attend secondary school. Being able to afford to send your child to secondary school is something we don't have to think about, so, as a UNICEF Rights Respecting School, we want to support Article 28 of the Conventions for the Rights of ALL children. This says that all children and young people have the right to education no matter where they live, who they are: regardless of race, gender or disability; if they're in detention, or if they're a refugee.

If you would like to support us in our 90kg challenge and buy some rice, it is available in the school office at a price of £4 per bag. It is the most delicious rice and is in packs of white or brown.
