

Miss Isherwood's Phonics Group:

<u>Monday</u>: Today, we will be learning the /air/ sound spelt as 'ere'. Watch the video on the class story and then complete the activity provided.

<u>Tuesday:</u> Today's alternative spelling is the phoneme /air/ spelt as 'ear' and 'are'. Can you identify the words in the passage? Can you sort these words into spelling categories?

<u>Wednesday</u>: Today, we are going to learn what a homograph is. Watch Miss Isherwood's video on the class story.

<u>Thursday:</u> Today's alternative spelling is 'al' and 'our' for the phoneme /or/, Watch the video before completing the activity.

<u>Friday:</u> Today, we will be practising spelling our Y2 Common Exception Words. Choose 5 words to practise. How creative can you be when writing these spellings?

Miss Clarkson's Phonics Group:

Monday: Today, we are going to look at different ways to spelt the sound 'ai'. Please read the story 'Sid the Snail' and write down any words you spot with the 'ai' sound in them. There are 29 words to find in the text. After you have found all of the words in the text, I would like you to sort them into their 'spelling groups'.

<u>Tuesday:</u> Today, we are going to continue to look at different ways to spell the 'ai' sound. Please use the image clues to help you spelt the 'ai' words. Don't forget to look at the top of each column to help you with which 'ai' spelling you need to use.

<u>Wednesday:</u> Today, we are going to look at different ways to spelt the sound 'f'. Please read the story 'Frankie and Fred' and write down any words you spot with the 'f' sound in them. After you have found all of the words in the text, I would like you to sort them into their 'spelling groups'.

<u>Thursday:</u> Today, we are going to recap the spelling families for 'ch', 'ow' and 'oi'. Watch Miss Clarkson's video to recap the rules and have a mini spelling quiz!

<u>Friday:</u> Today, you are going to play 'Phonopoly'. Use the board provided or create your own. There are challenge cards too!

Topic:

Monday: Today, we are going to be focusing on E-Safety and what we can do to help us stay safe when we are on the 'web'. Please read through the powerpoint for today's lessons and then complete the activity. In today's activity, you will need to read the letters of the children carefully and then write a short reply to them giving them advice. You need to apply your knowledge of keeping safe online in order to help them.

Tuesday: Today, you are going to design your own planet to make our of papier mache tomorrow. Have a look at some of the example planets posted under your 'To Do' section and then design your own.

We are going to be completing two different cricket challenges in P.E. Please refer to the challenge sheet see what you will require for the tasks. Please continuous.

Wednesday: Today, you are going to make your planet out of papier mache. Refer back to your design. Ask and adult to blow up your balloon. Cut up strips of newspaper, soak them in PVA glue mixed with water and create layers over the top of the balloon. You might want to do a few layers to make it sturdy.

Thursday: This afternoon, it is time to paint your plane. In order to do this, you must make sure that your planet is completely dry, otherwise when you pop the balloon it will collapse. Ask an adult to pop the balloon inside for you. Refer back to your design and choose your colours carefully. Do you need to mix any? Which colours will you need to mix to make the colour that you want?

Daily Activities:

Here are some short activities that we would encourage your child to be doing each day. These are activities that we would do every day in school; we often do these in short bursts of 10/15 minutes.

Reading - Children should aim to read each day. Your child will have been assigned a <u>Collins Big Cat e-book online</u> by the Year 2 team. Please refer back to Miss Bradley's video on the Armfield school story on Class Dojo if you are unsure how to access these or send us a message.

2, 5 and 10 times tables: Children should aim to practise these times tables every single day including division facts. It is really important that they can recall all facts for these tables by the end of Year 2. We are very lucky to have <u>Times Table Rockstars</u> for children to practise these on in a fun and engaging way. Your child's log in has been sent to you via Class Dojo. Alternatively, '<u>Hit the Button'</u> is another wonderful app should the children like a change every now and again.

Handwriting: In Year 2, children learn to join their cursive letters. Children should practise keeping their letters the same size and relative to the size of the lines on their page. They should make sure their ascenders reach the top line and the descenders drop below the line. Please refer to the <u>animations on the link here</u>. Children can watch the animations of the letter joins and have a go at practising themselves in their book.
