<u>Miss Ahmed/Mrs Maano's Group:</u>

<u>Monday:</u> Today's sound is 'y'. Watch <u>here.</u> <u>Tuesday:</u> Today's sound is 'ow'. Watch <u>here.</u> <u>Wednesday:</u> Today's sound is 'ie'. Watch here.

<u>Thursday:</u> Today's sound is 'aw'. Watch <u>here.</u> <u>Friday:</u> Let's recap the week. Watch <u>here.</u> <u>This week, we are going to be learning</u> how to add the γ' to root words. We are also going to learn and practise spelling of common words such as around, great, duck, horse, rabbit, small.

Topic:

Monday: This week we will be looking at how animals animals and plants rely on each other in simple food chains.

Watch this video to see how a food chain works. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zx882hv/articles/z3c2xnb Look at the food chain pictures, can you work out which belong in a food chain together? (Often the bigger animals are at one end, little creatures or plants at the other).

<u>Tuesday:</u> In P.E, we are going to Today, in P.E, we are going to warm up by performing all of our exercises. In the first activity you are going to throw a ball for accuracy and distance. Discuss the difference between the two forms of throwing and how technique may change depending on whether we are throwing for accuracy or distance. If you need an extra challenge...throw as far as possible; throw at a target on ground (eg. hoop); throw at a target on the wall; throw between markers; throw over a net/rope.

<u>Wednesday:</u> In Geography, we are going to be learning about jobs all around the world. Can you find a map of the world? This could be in a book or online or you could print one. There are going to be a range of photographs linked to jobs around the world (please request them from Miss Clarkson). Can you find where in the world where this job is done by the majority of its people? <u>Challenge -</u> Can you write a sentence next to each job to explain why that particular job is there?

<u>Thursday</u>: In R.E, we are learning how Muslims feel a sense of belonging when they prayer. Look at the images of Muslims praying in different places. Some Muslims pray at home alone, others go to a Mosque and pray together. Which image of prayer do you think would give Muslims the strongest sense of belonging? Cut out the picture and write a sentence explaining your choice.

Friday: In Computing, we are going to be learning all about email addresses. We are going to look at what needs to be in an email address and what can't be in an email address such as spaces and emojis. We are going to be sorting 'trash and treasure' email addresses and then we are going to have a go at writing our own email to the other class!

Daily Activities:

Here are some short activities that we would encourage your child to be doing each day. These are activities that we would do every day in school; we often do these in short bursts of 10/15 minutes.

Reading - Children should aim to read each day. Your child will have been assigned a <u>Collins Big Cat e-book online</u> by the Year 2 team. Please refer back to Miss Bradley's video on the Armfield school story on Class Dojo if you are unsure how to access these or send us a message. RIG CAT

2, 5 and 10 times tables: Children should aim to practise these times tables every single day including division facts. It is really important that they can recall all facts for these tables by the end of Year 2. We are very lucky to have Times Table Rockstars for children to practise these on in a fun and engaging way. Your child's log in has been sent to you via Class Dojo. Alternatively, 'Hit the Button' is another wonderful app should the children like a change every now and again.

Handwriting: In Year 2, children learn to join their cursive letters. Children should practise keeping their letters the same size and relative to the size of the lines on their page. They should make sure their ascenders reach the top line and the descenders drop below the line. Please refer to the animations on the link here. Children can watch the animations of the letter joins and have a go at practising themselves in their book. igh ing
