Personal, Social and Emotional development

Children to develop relationships and friendships with new staff members and other children in the class. How to be a good friend.

Activities- Ball games, name games, circle times and making a friendship beanstalk.

Links- Demonstrates friendly behaviour, initiating conversations and forming good relationships with peers and familiar adults.

Communication and Language

Encourage speaking and listening during whole class sessions, build up confidence and the ability to comprehend stories.

Activities- circle/story times, small group activities

Links- Developing understanding of simple concepts

Uses language as a powerful means of sharing feelings, experiences and thoughts.

Physical Development

To embed independence and self-care into the routines. To develop balancing skills.

Activities- Daily physical, circle times, modelling routine, practicing toilet times, snack times. Balance boards and benches.

Links- Beginning to be independent in self-care. To show greater control with balancing on body parts and on equipment.

Mathematics

To consolidate counting to 10 or 20 and to talk about properties of 2D shapes and recognise and name them.

Activities- Counting daily: (children, magic beans, farm animals), shape hunts in the environment.

Links- Recites some number names in sequence. Notices simple shapes and patterns in pictures/recognise and names 2D shapes.

Extra Events

Book at Bedtime

Easter

To enjoy a range of stories and join in with the repeated refrains/ and notice the rhyming words. Copy letters from their name. Daily Phase 1 Phonics.

Literacy

Activities- finding names, practicing writing names, story sequencing cards, what's in the box? (initial sounds game).

Links- Recognises familiar words and signs such as own name and advertising logos.

Sometimes gives meaning to marks as they draw and paint

Understanding the World

Talk about different life cycles and properties of materials.

Activities- grow beans, herbs, caterpillar to butterfly kit, IWB, magnifying glasses (a variety of materials)

Links- Talk about features they have observed in the environment and notice changes of growth as they occur.

Expressive Art and Design

Use colours and collage to represent a range of characters from the stories. To explore musical instruments.

Activities- painting, collage, Fairy Tale role play masks

Links- Realises tools can be used for a purpose. To explore different percussion instruments to represent different characters from the stories.
