Reading

This year, children will continue to choose their own reading books and will change them on a designated day. Your child will be given a day on which they are heard read and will complete weekly guided reading sessions in class.


Children should be reading at home as often as possible and we recommend a few pages every evening with discussion to promote enjoyment of reading. We would also like to emphasise the importance of parents and carers reading to their children (books that they would not necessarily be able to access independently) to further promote a love for reading and develop their vocabulary.

Please ensure your child brings their reading pack into school every day in case of changes to the timetable that allow for reading to take place.

Spellings

Each week your child will bring home a number of spellings to learn in preparation for a weekly spelling test. The spellings given will correspond with the sounds taught in phonics that week. These will be sent home on Fridays for children to practise at home. Spelling tests will then take place on the following Friday each week. Children will complete their spelling


test in a spelling book, which will be sent home with your child in their reading book bag. This spelling book must be returned to school so your child can complete their next test inside the book.



Spelling Suggestions

Here are a few suggestions to help your child learn their spellings at home.

- Create a set of flash cards with the word on one side and the meaning on the other.
- Use alphabet magnets or scrabble tiles to spell out words.
- Write sentences for each word.
- Create a word search or crossword puzzle.
- Type the spellings on a computer.
- Write a story using all the spellings.
- Use 'Spelling City' website <u>http://www.spellingcity.com/</u> Parents can register for the free version and input your child's spelling word lists. Your child can then play games and activities or take practice tests on the site.



- Use Discovery Education's puzzlemaker tool <u>http://www.discoveryeducation.com/free-puzzlemaker</u>. You can create a word search using your child's spelling words.
- Alphabetize the word list.
- Sit down with your child, two pencils and a piece of paper. Tell your child the spelling word you'll be practising and write the first letter of the word. Pass the paper, so your child can add the next letter. You add the letter after that, repeating until the word is completed.
- Use old magazines or newspapers to find spelling words and cut them out.

<u>P.E</u>

We will try and respond to you as soon as we can within the school day.
