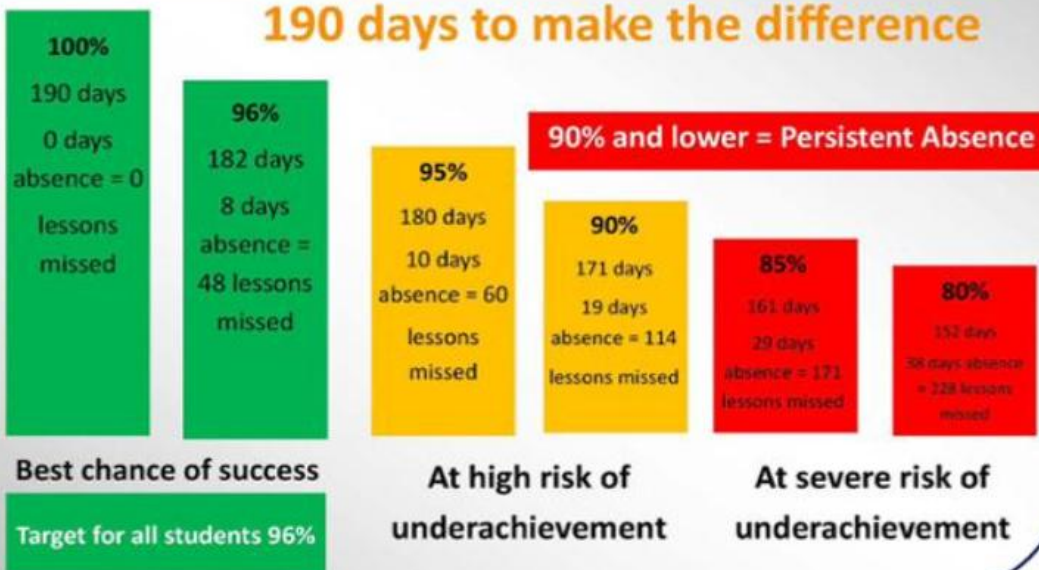
Good attendance means


Secondary school library
