## In Maths

In maths this half term we will be continuing with Place Value (within 50), including multiples of 2 and 5. At home try practising counting things that come in 2s, socks, knives and forks. Count fingers on everyone's hands to practise counting in 5s. Then we will move on to numbers to 100.

## In Science

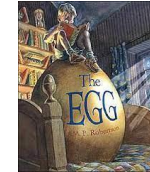
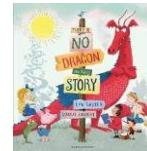
In science, we will be learning about 'Plants'. The children will draw, make and label the parts of plants and trees as well observing seasonal change.
