

Nursery - Stick Man

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| <p><u>English</u></p> <p>To listen to the Stick Man story and use your knowledge to re-tell it and also sequence the characters it. https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b06t09rk/stick-man Talk about kindness as Stick Man and Santa are kind. Make a family tree and add kindness leaves, writing about someone who helped them. Engage in daily Jolly Phonics songs and Phase 1 listening activities - aspect 4 - rhythm and rhyme</p> | <p><u>Understanding the world</u></p> <p>To talk about the changing seasons in the book. Have you ever played in a woodland or snow? Play pooh sticks outdoors. What is the best way for them to move around? Floating and sinking activities in the water tray. Will they float like Stick Man does? Can you defrost Stick Man who is trapped in the ice? Christmas - look at the ways some people celebrate Christmas</p> | |
| <p><u>Maths</u></p> <p>Daily counting to 20 - jumps, claps, children etc To sometimes match numerals to quantities correctly. Can you place spots on leaves correctly onto the correct numbers on the tree? Stick Man flashcards to develop number recognition (1-5) and (1-10) and (11-20) Be able to match number to quantity. Use 2D shapes to design a flag for their sandcastles outdoors</p> | <p><u>Physical Development</u></p> <p>Ascribe meaning to marks made when drawing favourite parts of the story Manipulate twigs to make your Stick Family and playdough to make stick letters Large chalks outdoors to draw around children's outlines</p> | <p><u>Art and Design</u></p> <p>Painting story themed paintings Provide red and green paint. Can you make different shades of brown to paint your Stick Man with? Provide tubes, twigs, pipe cleaners for children to make their own Stick Man</p> |
| <p><u>PSED and Communication and Language</u></p> <p>Talk about families - differences and similarities to their own. Talk about Stick Man being lost. Discuss how to stay safe and what to do if they ever get lost. Stick Man helped Santa. Talk about who we help and add leaves to a kindness tree. Role play masks for the children to work together and role-play the story.</p> | <p><u>Outside</u></p> <p>Natural objects to explore Play a listening game - one child in the middle of the circle, eyes closed, another child, away from the circle, says 'I'm Stick Man, I'm Stick Man, I'm Stick Man that's me,' in a disguised voice for child to guess</p> | <p><u>Things to do at home</u></p> <p>Practise drawing different sized circles using an anti-clockwise motion Use scissors to strengthen finger muscles Collect sticks and order them in size</p> |
