Physical Development

The children will continue to focus on fundamental movement skills in PE and take part in the Daily Mile and Balance Bike sessions.

We will also focus on pencil control and using small tools effectively to cut, paint and draw.

Maths

The children will continue to follow the White Rose Maths curriculum. As mathematicians, we will be developing our understanding of numbers to 10. We will learn representation and composition of numbers, how to write these numbers and how to find one more, one less. We will also be developing skills in mass and capacity and developing vocabulary like 'heavier, lighter, full, empty'. We will also be learning about length, height and time and an understanding or ordering and sequencing.

Communication, Language and Literacy

In EYFS we focus on listening, attention and understanding and speaking. Our T4W (Talk 4 Writing) focus this term will be on growth and change. The main text we will be using is 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle.

We will be reading a range of other fiction and non-fiction texts like, 'Handa's Surprise' and 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. We will be developing our speaking skills by re-telling stories and learning traditional Nursery Rhymes.

Daily phonics sessions will continue with a review of Phase 3 then double letters. The children will not learn any more new sounds this term, but they should continue to practise the sounds already taught. Thank you for your continued support at home.

Personal, Social and Emotional

Expressive Art and Design
