<b>A.</b>	Increased levels of progress in literacy for pupils eligible for PP.	Pupils eligible for PP in Phase 3 make more progress by the end of the year than 'other' pupils so that at least 50% exceed progress targets and 100% meet expected targets. Other pupils still make at least the expected progress. This will be evidenced using accelerated reader assessments and English written assessments in December, March and June.
<b>B.</b>	Improved rates of progress for higher attaining pupils eligible for PP.	Pupils eligible for PP identified as high attaining from KS1 and KS3 (raw scores) make as much progress as 'other' pupils identified as high attaining, across Key Stage 1 and 3, so that 85% or above are on track for positive progress 8 scores by the end of KS4.
<b>C.</b>	Improved resilience and academic progress	Pupils eligible for PP make as much progress as Non-PP students. Where they do not, individual subject areas are putting in place various interventions, monitored by phase leads and senior team.
