Reading

In nursery we have whole class stories daily. Children are also encouraged to enjoy books independently, read them using the picture cues and begin to understand that we read the text from top to bottom and left to right.



Class Dojo

School Readiness

Please help to develop your child's school readiness skills by supporting and promoting the following:

- Playing cooperatively with others
- Following a 2-3 step instruction
- Working independently and also independently dressing
- Sharing and taking turns and showing empathy
- Initiating and maintaining conversations
- · Listening and concentrating for longer periods of time
- Taking care of their belongings and also own personal care needs

Extended Opportunities:

Throughout their time in nursery, children will have the opportunity to take part in the Bikeability programme, additional speech and language support, if needed, access the sensory room, library, dance studio and the school's very own 'Teepee'.
