Classroom routines



Reading

Children will have a book to read at home every day. They can bring it back as soon as they have read it, in order to quiz on it and receive a new one.



Homework

Children will receive a small amount of maths and English homework on a Friday and it should be returned before the Wednesday of the following week. They will also receive spellings each week.



PE Kit

Children will need to be in their full PE Kit on a Tuesday and Thursday for PE lessons or swimming. During the rest of the week they may complete the Daily Mile activities in their normal uniform.

*June 2023*Year 4 Multiplication Check

In Year 4 children undertake a National Multiplication Check, to ensure that they know their times tables up to 12s, which is the expectation by the end of Year 4. They are given 25 questions and 6 seconds to answer each one. They should be getting as close to 25 as possible.
