Another week and more changes to self-isolation rules! Having looked at the new guidance, I would just like to (hopefully) make clear what it says. The government has stated: From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace.

If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Day 0 of the isolation period is when you first show symptoms or, if asymptomatic, the day you took your test.

If you usually book the whole week of dinners, please do this in the usual way on ParentPay.
