If you or your child does exhibit a symptom of Covid 19, it is extremely important that you book a PCR test and self-isolate whilst waiting for the result. We also know that with us all getting back together and as we enter autumn, there will be other illnesses doing the rounds. We want to keep your children in school as it is the best place for their learning and developing their social skills, we therefore recommend regular lateral flow testing to detect asymptomatic cases. Test kits are available locally.

From National Online Safety: Angler phishing. Clickjacking. 'Payment first' scams. Bogus quizzes. There's no shortage of ingenuity among online fraudsters when coming up with new and convincing ways to obtain our personal information — and our money — by dishonest means. Social media, with an estimated 4.4 billion users worldwide, has become a profitable hunting ground.

Our #WakeUpWednesday guide this week explains how scammers abuse social media platforms for criminal purposes. It will help you understand what kind of information fraudsters look for, some of the ways that they might attempt to trick you into cooperating, and how you can learn to spot a social media scam — even when it's disguised as something innocuous and fun.
