With the Prime Minister's announcement that the full easing of lockdown is to be delayed by four weeks, we have had to reconsider some of our plans for the remainder of this term. We can still hold our internal transition sessions for the children so they will meet their new teachers and spend time in their new classes on 1st July with other, shorter, transition sessions planned for the same week. As with last year, school reports will be sent out towards the end of the term via email, so please ensure that we have your latest email address.

Just a reminder that if your child has any medication in school, including Epi-pens, please ensure that it is still in date. We check periodically and will let you know but it is the responsibility of the parent / carer to make sure that we have in date products in school.

The recent heatwave has been a welcome change for many of us. However, it has also meant that those of us who suffer from hay fever have had a pretty bad time of it. If you feel that your child needs medication during these times, please make sure that you contact the school office and complete a medication

form. Schools are not obliged to administer medication but neither do we want to see the children suffer. We must be notified of any medication that is brought into school and all products should be handed into the school office. Any medication that we administer has to be witnessed by another responsible adult and parents / carers are notified. Because antihistamines are administered only when needed, we also require that you let us know on the day that your child will need to be medicated. As you will appreciate, this can be quite time consuming so we ask that you only send in medication (along with the completed form) when it is absolutely necessary, thank you.

Thank you to those of you who managed to retrieve some lost property earlier this week. Please ensure that all your child's clothing is labelled with their name as this makes returning items to their rightful owners much easier. If clothing is named using a pen, this fades over time and needs re-writing. Any lost property that we cannot return will be donated to a clothing bank.

The use of technology is second nature for many of today's children. When used correctly, it is wonderful. However, technology and its applications are changing constantly and it can be difficult to keep up with it. We recognise this in school and do what we can to keep our children safe online. We have been reviewing our online safety policy and would like to have your views on it. You will find a copy of the draft policy attached to this email.
