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We are now rapidly approaching the end of the term and it has been really great having a full school. I feel really proud of how the children have settled back in over the last few weeks; it feels like they were never away!

There is a requirement for someone in school to be available for test and trace purposes up until 7th April. If your child develops symptoms or tests positive for Covid 19 up until that date, please email me at head@arnovale.notts.sch.uk so that I can notify the relevant authorities and contact all those who would need to selfisolate. I will make contact with you by email so it is important that you check your mail box regularly. Families of school aged children can access lateral flow testing kits to use at home. We urge you to take advantage of this and test yourselves twice a week in order to detect asymptomatic cases. For more information, please follow the link below:

Parents and carers of children who have been advised to self-isolate by their education setting or by NHS Test and Trace are now able to apply for a Test and Trace Support Payment or discretionary payment of £500, if they meet the eligibility criteria. The extension of the Test and Trace Support Payment scheme, which is administered by district and unitary local authorities in England, ensures that parents receive the financial support they need if they are unable to attend work due to childcare responsibilities.

We know that some of the older children walk to and from school by themselves and that because of this, some of them carry a mobile phone. We ask that a phone is only brought in <u>if absolutely necessary</u> and if this is the case, the children must hand their phone in to their teacher at the start of the day and then collect it at home time; this is for safeguarding reasons. We will keep them in a safe place but cannot be held responsible for them. The children should not use them whilst on the school premises.

Some of you will have received an email through Medical Tracker informing you of a first aid incident involving your child at school. This system replaces the old paper one we used to have and means that you receive the notification much quicker and there is no chance of it being lost in the bottom of a school bag! When we input the information, it generates a letter from a template that is emailed to you. Just because you receive the notification so promptly does not mean that the first aid incident is serious; if it is, we will also contact you personally.
