We have almost made it and what a term it has been! Most children will have had only 20 days in school since Christmas but all of them have coped really well with the transition from remote learning to being back in the classroom. Of course, there is still a long journey ahead of us until we go back to the old normal. I hope you manage to have a restful Easter and although it means that the children are home again, at least there is no remote learning to complete! We have had a number of parents asking us about when we will be resuming swimming, music tuition and after school clubs. In school, we have had many discussions about these aspects of school life and would like to start them again once we are able to. We have decided that at present, it is a little early. Because of the Covid risk assessment that we are required to have and adhere to, it makes it very difficult to find spaces for children to go for music tuition. We normally have mixed age groups for guitar which is something we cannot do at present. Limiting the tuition groups to year groups would ultimately reduce the

size of the groups and increase the cost of each lesson. Swimming poses a problem as we rely on parent volunteers, using a coach to transport the children and also the fact that as indoor swimming can only start again after April 12th, it would not give us long enough to provide all the lessons required for the children. We therefore plan to re-start swimming lessons for the autumn term. We usually offer this to Year 3 but as they have missed out this year, we shall move this to Year 4. With regards to after school clubs, at present our teachers and teaching assistants are required to be on duty each break time with their children which has an impact upon the work they need to do after school and in their own time. Again, once Covid measures have been relaxed, we will look to reinstate some of the clubs we have previously run.

Thank you to all of you for your generosity on Red Nose Day. In total, we raised £357.50 for this fantastic charity.
