It is really important to remember that there are members of our community both in and out of school who are classed as vulnerable and so the need for social distancing, high standards of hygiene and vigilance is as important as it ever was. If your child or anyone in your household shows any of the symptoms of Covid 19, it is important that they are kept off school and a test is arranged. We will always aim for the highest standards when it comes to educating the children at Arno Vale but we do ask you to bear with us when we have staff absences as some positions are much harder to cover than others and ultimately, it results in us spreading our existing resources out more thinly.

We often celebrate this day with a cake sale but due to the current circumstances, we have decided that instead we will hold a non-uniform day. You may be aware of the controversy surrounding the free school meal vouchers over the half term break. Nottinghamshire County Council has pledged that "Any child who is currently entitled to free school meals will continue to receive support of £15 each week funded by the council applied retrospectively for the two-week period of half term." At present, schools are waiting for information as to how this will work and as soon as we know, we will inform you.

If you have not already signed up to ClassDojo, please do so as soon as you can as this is our main method of providing work and feedback in the event of your child not being able to attend school due to Covid 19 related reasons.

May I also take this opportunity to remind you of some of our operational measures

we have put in place in order to keep everyone as safe as possible.

- Staggered start and end times to the school day, please ensure you are on time.
- We are actively encouraging all visitors to site to wear a face covering.
- Please make sure that you adhere to social distancing measures whilst waiting on the school premises and on the footpaths outside of school.
- Use of the one way system through the school grounds at the end of the day.

As the weather gets colder, please ensure

that you provide your child with extra layers to wear in the classroom (as in line with government guidance, we do have to keep the classes well ventilated by opening some windows in order to reduce the risk of aerosol transmission) and most of our PE lessons will be outside, so your child may need warm outdoor clothing including hats and gloves.
