AVJS Bulletin: 7th January 2022

Happy New Year to you all! I hope you all had a relaxing and enjoyable Christmas and that you managed to stay well. Thanks also for your understanding this week with staff illnesses, we are hoping to get back to some sort of normality next week (fingers crossed!).

It is reassuring that the symptoms of the Omicron variant of Covid 19 do appear to be milder than previous variants, but the fact that it is more easily transmissible can be a problem. Although the NHS still ask us to look out for the three main symptoms of a high temperature, persistent new cough and the loss of sense of taste or smell, it is becoming more widely recognised that other symptoms, particularly in children, are being presented. A doctor from the World Health Organisation has said that in children, symptoms may also include a sore throat or sneeze and some gastrointestinal symptoms like diarrhoea or vomiting (although they tend to be mild). A headache has also been reported as a symptom. From 11th January, if someone tests positive on a lateral flow test, they no longer need to have this confirmed with a PCR test but must self-isolate immediately. It is still a requirement that if someone is displaying symptoms, that they book a PCR test by phoning 119 or through the gov.uk website.

As you will have experienced, the temperature has dropped significantly since New Year. We are still having to keep the school well ventilated throughout the day which means having some windows open. Unfortunately, this can mean that the temperature in some of the rooms may be a little lower than we would like. Please make sure that your child is wearing suitable layers (they may need a fleece) in order to keep comfortable during the day. We will still be

teaching PE outdoors whenever we can, so it is important that the children have a separate outdoor PE kit which could include jogging bottoms and a fleece or a coat, hat and gloves but should also have different trainers to their indoor PE kit, thank you.
