- The National Curriculum for maths has three strands, and children are exposed to all of them on a daily basis:
- Fluency (rapid recall, strong knowledge of basic facts, efficient written calculation methods etc...)
- Reasoning (knowing the 'how' and 'why'. Being able to explain the maths).
- Problem solving (applying the above skills to new and different contexts).
- Our Calculation Policy (available on our website) is in place to ensure a consistent approach to the teaching of written calculation methods in order to enhance children's progression and understanding.

Please keep an eye out for other events later in the year.
