You may be aware that a number of years ago,

the government introduced a policy where schools could opt out of local authority control and become an academy. Over the years, more schools have taken this option and many have formed academy trusts. The benefits of this include closer collaboration where schools can share good practice, increased opportunities for continual professional development and support for teaching and curriculum development from educational experts. Many of the mundane administration jobs that the senior leadership team currently have to perform are dealt with by a central team leaving school leaders more time to focus on teaching and learning. Academies also have access to other funding streams. Over the last year, the governing body and senior leadership team at Arno Vale have been considering the best way forward for the school (as you may have seen in our school improvement plan). After extensive research, we have decided to

partner with the White Hills Park Trust which is a multi academy trust containing primary and secondary schools along with a special school. We know that this partnership will bring lots of advantages for the children at Arno Vale and we are looking forward to working closely with them. We would like to invite you to a presentation from White Hills Park Trust on Wednesday, 10<sup>th</sup> May at 6.30pm in the school hall where you will have the opportunity to find out more and ask any questions.

Some of you will be aware that over Easter, we sadly lost one of our parents, Phil Marsh, and our thoughts are with his family. One of Phil's friends, Ollie Sanderson along with a group of other friends, have organised to do a charity challenge, cycling 150 miles over two days in June to raise money for Alzheimer's research as Phil's own father recently passed away with the disease.
