Attendance

We are committed to working with parents and carers to provide the best possible opportunities for children to learn. To achieve this, we expect good attendance from all of the pupils. Parents have a responsibility to ensure that their children can access their education by having good attendance and being punctual. Good attendance has been shown to promote successful learning. It sets a foundation for the positive habits needed in the next phases of education and later in the workplace.

If you feel it is necessary for your child to take leave during term time, an application form must be completed (these can be collected from the office or printed from our attendance policy). Unless it is deemed an exceptional circumstance, the absence will be unauthorised. We have a statutory duty to monitor attendance and we will inform you if it falls below 90%. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Note: We absolutely understand that children get genuinely ill from time to time.

Here is a useful table that shows the impact that absence can have on children's outcomes:

Above	Less than 6 days absence a year! Excellent attendance!
97%	Pupils with this attendance should achieve the best outcomes they can.
95%	Less than 10 days absence in a year!
	Pupils with this attendance are likely to achieve the best outcomes they can.
90%	20 days absence over the year!
	Pupils with this attendance are missing a month of school per year and are very likely to fall behind in maths, English and other subjects; it will be difficult for them to achieve their best.
85%	30 days absence in a year!
	These pupils are missing 6 weeks of school a year!
	It will be very difficult for them to keep up and achieve their best.
80%	Pupils with this attendance are missing a day for every week of school!
	It will be almost impossible to keep up with their work.

Club Vale

Parents that pay using childcare vouchers - if you make any changes or cancellations, please email clubvale@arnovale.notts.sch.uk to notify us of the amendments. Please note, next week we will be sending out booking forms for voucher payment bookings for the Spring term.

Reminders from previous bulletins:

- Children are allowed to bring in a healthy snack to eat at play time (a piece of fruit is ideal). Please note that crisps and chocolate are not allowed at playtimes as these do not constitute a healthy snack. Also, a reminder that we are strictly a nut free site.
- Over the counter medication can be accepted in exceptional circumstances but a medicine form will need to be completed.
