The internet and digital world can bring so many benefits and advantages to us all and for some of us, it is difficult to image life without it. For our children, using the internet is becoming second nature and it isan increasingly important aspect of their lives. However, along with the many benefits, there are also some risks and difficulties. We frequently hear of children falling out, upsetting others, being upset and sending unpleasant messages over their gaming platforms. We know that many children are playing Fortnite at home but it is crucial that you know what is going on in your child's digital life.

To help them stay safe and happy online, here are some steps that you can take:

- Limit the amount of time that your child spends online.
- Regularly check your child's devices. Look at what messages they have been sending and receiving, check their browsing history and the apps that they are accessing.
 - Apply parental controls.
- Check the age restrictions for the apps they are using; you may be surprised that many of them are not recommended for children under 13.
 - Ensure that they play their online games in a room with other adults in the house.
 - Remind them of what to do if they feel unsafe, unhappy or concerned online.
