Our governing body and senior leadership team work very closely together to make sure that the children at Arno Vale Junior School receive the best education they can. As you will know, every year we write a School Improvement Plan focusing on the main areas that we would like to improve. Each of the curriculum subjects is led by a teacher (most teachers have more than one subject area) and they write curriculum plans, support other teachers and monitor the children's learning in that subject. They meet with governors and produce reports for the governing body. The full document is very comprehensive and has a list of actions that we are working on and governors are kept informed of developments.
