

Bulletin: 24th May 2024

We are now at the end of yet another half term and I am hoping that we have some better weather next week! Due to a variety of reasons, we had to re-schedule this today's open morning; we have almost finalised alternative dates, these will be communicated to you after the half term break.

The next half term looks like it will be as busy as this one and please don't forget, the children's first day back in school will be Tuesday, 4th June as we have an Inset day on Monday, 3rd June.

Tiktok, Whatsapp, Snapchat, Instagram, YouTube....and these are only a few of the social media platforms that are available today. Although they can be really useful and provide us with some great information, they can also be the source of some very inappropriate content.

Many schools, including Arno Vale, are frequently being made aware of issues that are happening outside of school hours between children who are using some of these platforms.

We have had reports of some sexualised conversations being held between children and behaviours that are not only unpleasant, but if unchecked and allowed to continue, would be classed as bullying and can be very damaging.

Recently, we have also been notified of unpleasant messages being sent on Snapchat; the issue with this is that once the message has been read, it can automatically delete itself.

In our PSHE (personal, social and health education) lessons, we teach the children how to stay safe online and what to do if they are worried.

We urge you to check what apps your children are accessing on their devices and apply parental controls. It is also vital that you regularly monitor your child's online activity. Many of the apps (including **all** of the above named ones) have a lower age limit of 13, this is due to some of the content and because younger children do not generally have the emotional maturity to cope with them.

We are still analysing your constructive feedback from our recent parent questionnaire and there are some common threads. We are also looking at how we can implement some of your suggestions, for example, a review of the Club Vale booking procedures and a revision of our homework policy. We will publish our findings after half term. In the meantime, our class ambassadors are working on a project to gather the children's opinion on school meals. So far, we have had some very constructive feedback from them. Their last project resulted in some key improvements to playtimes which has proven to be successful.

If your child has drumming lessons with Dan Piper, he is planning for the children to do a performance for you! He will be contacting you directly to let you know the specifics, but it will be on the afternoon of June 12th for years 3 and 4 and the afternoon of June 13th for years 5 and 6.

I know that some of you have been asking and wondering about what is happening with regards to Arno Vale joining the White Hills Park trust. As you will already know, the academy order has been signed which means it is going to happen. We initially hoped that we would be joining last November. We then thought it would be this spring. We finally had notification from the county council that it is scheduled to be in November 2024. However, the trust (who have had experience of these things) thinks that it is more than likely not going to be before January 2025. This is very frustrating for everyone involved and I have tried to find out from the county council why this is but we are unable to get a clear explanation from them. However, this has not prevented close work between the school and the trust. We already feel as though we are part of White Hills Park and receive the same levels of support as the schools who are already within the trust. If things change and we get a firm date for conversion, I will let you know.

As part of their art lessons, the children in year 4 have made a mouth watering picnic as you will see below. However, as good as the food items look, I would not recommend actually eating them as they are made from paper, tape and Modroc. I think you will agree, the children have done a fantastic job!


