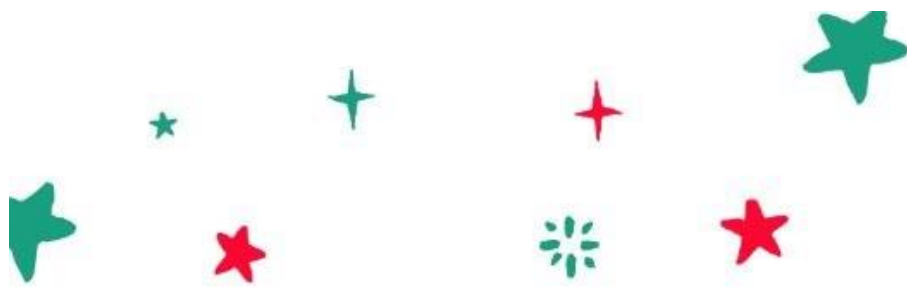




Bulletin: 6th December 2024

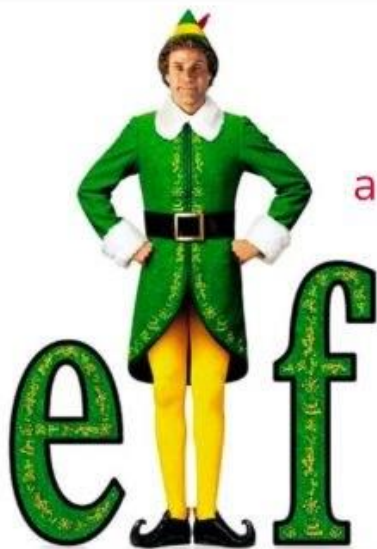

In 1st place earning 20 minutes of reward time were 3White.

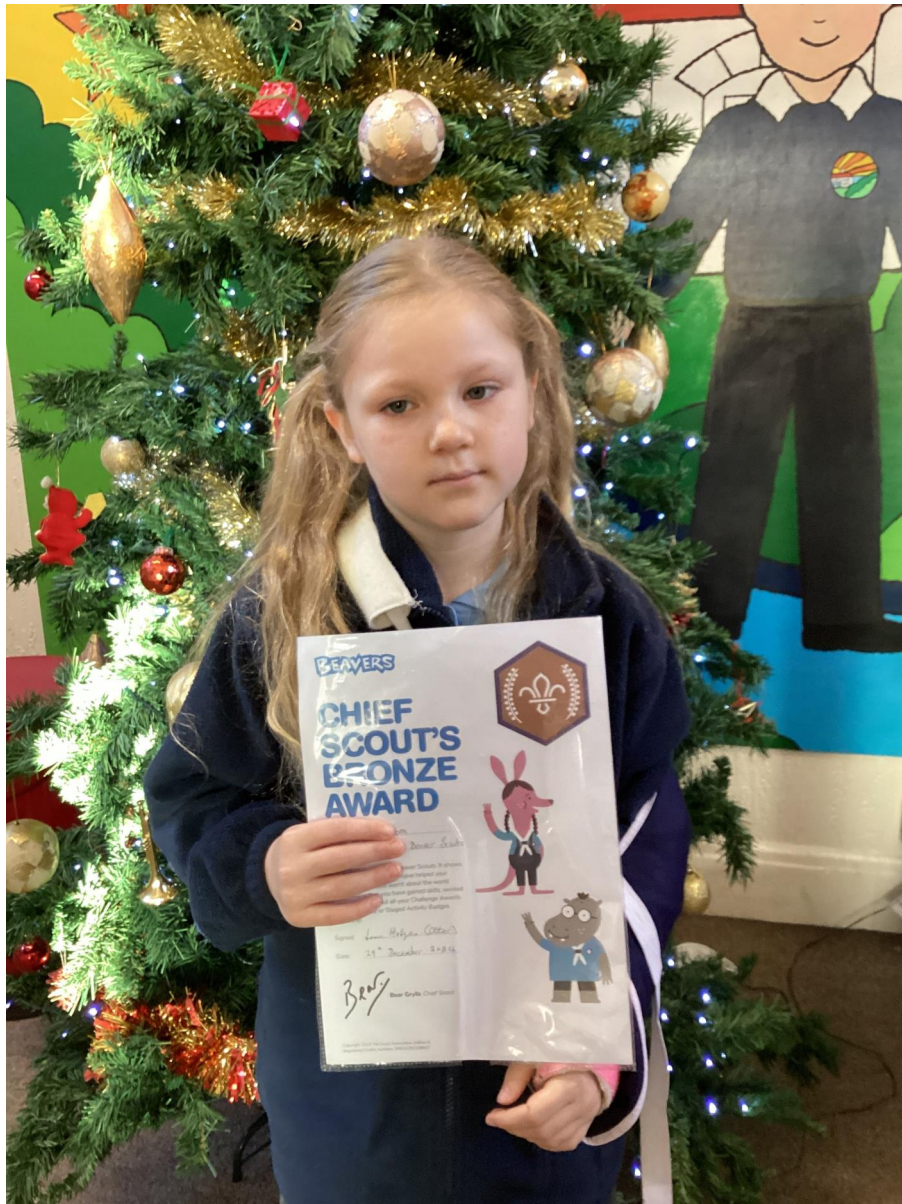
Year 3 were given a special mention for their amazing effort to work towards this challenge.
