

Bulletin: 6th October 2023



for their new addition at the start of next week. We wish them all the best of luck and are looking forward to meeting Baby Creane in the not too distant future.



child	uild's attendance at school is really important. Good attendance means the ren will make progress in their learning and enjoy time with their friends ping their social skills. We understand that children get poorly from time to time and if you have any concerns, please contact us.	
Above 97%	Less than 6 days absence a year! Excellent attendance! Pupils with this attendance should achieve the best grades they can.	
95%	Less than 10 days absence in a year! Pupils with this attendance are likely to achieve their target grades.	
90%	20 days absence over the year! Pupils with this attendance are missing a month of school per year and may fall behind in Maths, English and other subjects; it will be difficult for them to achieve their best	
85%	30 days absence in a year! These pupils are missing 6 weeks of school a year! It will be very difficult for them to keep up and achieve their best.	
80%	Pupils with this attendance are missing a day for every week of school! It will be almost impossible to keep up with their work.	

2 - You may have seen in the press that the Department for Education has a focus on attendance at the moment and local authorities and education trusts are having to revise their policies and procedures regarding attendance and absences. Along with our governing body, we too are reviewing our attendance policy and there will be some changes. Once this is complete and has been agreed by the governing body, we will be sharing this with you. As a reminder, please see the table which equates absence to missed learning time.



3 - October is Black History Month and we will be finding out about some people from the past and present who have battled adversity and prejudice over the years. It is also the 75th anniversary of Windrush. Many years ago, George Africanus was enslaved in Sierra Leone in Africa and brought to Wolverhampton where he trained as a brass founder. He later moved to Nottingham where he bought a property in Chandler's Lane close to the market square. He became an entrepreneur and is commemorated by a green plaque on the railings of St Mary's Church where he was buried in 1934.



4 - On Tuesday it is World Mental Health Day which is about 'raising awareness of mental health and driving positive change for everyone's mental health' The children will be doing some age appropriate work on this and we invite them to wear something green or yellow if they wish. Of course, this is entirely optional and the children can come to school in their normal school uniform. We are not asking for any donations.
