School dinners need to be booked before midnight on Sunday 18th February. Please note there have been some changes to the menu for next half term. You can have a look at the menu on our website.


Please clear any outstanding debts before the start of the new term on ParentPay, thank you.

We are committed to working with parents and carers to provide the best possible opportunities for children to learn. To achieve this, we expect good attendance from all of the pupils. Parents have a responsibility to ensure that their children can access their education by having good attendance and being punctual. Good attendance has been shown to promote successful learning. It sets a foundation for the positive habits needed in the next phases of education and later in the workplace.

If you feel it is necessary for your child to take leave during term time, an application form must be completed (these can be collected from the office or printed from our attendance policy). Unless it is deemed an exceptional circumstance, the absence will be unauthorised. We have a statutory duty to monitor attendance and we will inform you if it falls below 90%*. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Note: We absolutely understand that children get genuinely ill from time to time.

*Since September 2023

If your child's attendance is 90%, that means they have been absent for 10%. That equates to 47.5 hours of missed learning time.

If your child's attendance is 85%, that means they have been absent for 15%. That equates to 71 hours of missed learning time.

If your child's attendance is 80%, that means they have been absent for 20%. That equates to 95 hours of missed learning time.
