### **Saville Road Closure**

*We have been informed by Via (in partnership with Nottinghamshire County Council) that they intend to carry out highway drainage maintenance works on the junction of Saville Road and Arno Vale Road on Thursday 22nd January from 9.30am-2.30pm. Saville Road will be closed during this time but I have been assured that this will not impact on school pick up and drop off arrangements.*

### **General messages and reminders from previous bulletins:**

#### **Punctuality**

*We would like to remind everyone of the importance of children arriving at school on time each day. Even arriving just 5 minutes late may not seem much, but if this happens every day it adds up to 975 minutes of missed learning time over the school year – that's over 16 hours.*

*Arriving late can also have other impacts on children. It can be unsettling to enter the classroom once learning has started, may cause them to miss important instructions and can affect their confidence and focus for the rest of the lesson. It can also disrupt learning for other children.*

*We really appreciate your support in helping children arrive on time so they can start the day calmly, confidently and ready to learn.*

#### **Site safety / staff car park**

*You may have noticed a marked pedestrian walkway to the main entrance. This is to make sure that those using the main entrance (for example, Club Vale families) have a safe and designated path to walk along. We will soon be installing some improved signage to help guide both pedestrians and vehicles.*

*Please note that cars should not be driven up the drive to the main entrance when dropping off or picking up children. This area is designated for staff parking only, and we are keen to minimise vehicle movement there to maintain a safe environment.*

#### **School dinners**

*A reminder that we are currently trialling a new system that allows parents to book school meals for individual days if they want to, rather than having to block-book for a full week.*

*For this system to work effectively, we ask that all meal bookings are completed by midnight on Saturday for the following week. Although food orders will usually have been placed in advance, having accurate bookings by this deadline will allow the catering team to plan meal preparation efficiently.*

If you forget to make your booking by the deadline, please email [office@arnovale.notts.sch.uk](mailto:office@arnovale.notts.sch.uk) by 9:00am on the Monday morning, clearly stating your child's name, class and the days required for a school dinner. The office team will then make the booking on your behalf. We will be completing a dinner register with the children each day rather than only on Monday mornings; however, it is essential that the above deadlines are followed for the system to run smoothly. Please also remember to ensure your child's dinner account has sufficient funds.

### *Booking and payment procedure:*

- Log into MCAS.
- Navigate to the dinner menu.
- Select add dinner money (£3.00 per day) if needed.
- From the main menu, click on the day you require, select main menu and press submit. This will turn the day green.
- Repeat the previous step for all other days that you require.

*Note: If your child receives free school meals, the office will continue to make your bookings daily for you.*
