- Lead by example, showing our school values and following our rules

Children who would like to put themselves forward will have the opportunity to explain to their class why they think they would be a good ambassador and the qualities they have. We will then hold an election day in a few weeks, where every child will visit our polling station to cast their votes – a great chance to see democracy in action! Apply for Free School Meals – Important for You and Our School

If your child is eligible for free school meals, we strongly encourage you to apply. Not only will your child benefit, but the school also receives extra funding to enhance our provision for all pupils.

Applying is quick and easy. You will need:

- Your National Insurance Number (or National Asylum Support Service Reference Number)
 - Your surname
 - Your date of birth
 - Your child's full details, including their date of birth and school

You can apply online via <u>Nottinghamshire County Council's website</u> or by calling 0300 500 80 80.

Who can get free school meals?

Your child may qualify if you receive any of the following:

- Universal Credit (with an annual net income of no more than £7,400)
 - Income Support
 - Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
 - Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
 - Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
 - The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (without Working Tax Credit), with an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after stopping qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
 - Families with no recourse to public funds may also qualify under certain income thresholds (please call to apply).

If eligible, free school meals usually start within two working days.

Please act quickly – funding allocations for schools are based on the census, which takes place in just a few weeks.

Road Safety

Last year, several of you raised concerns about dangerous and inconsiderate parking around school. We took these very seriously and worked hard with the relevant authorities to address the issue. One of our biggest priorities was to have a school crossing patrol reinstated on Arno Vale Road. We are delighted that this is now in place – a really positive step to help keep our children and families safe.

However, we all need to play our part in making sure the crossing patrol staff can do their job properly. As adults, we must set the right example to the children by using the patrol correctly and showing respect at all times. Unfortunately, we've had several reports this week of children – and in some cases parents – being rude to crossing patrol staff, ignoring their instructions and questioning why they should follow them. On Wednesday, there was also a serious concern when some children crossed in other places, running out from behind parked cars. Thankfully, no one was hurt, but we were told it was a very close call.

Road safety is something we will be talking about in school, and we are booking road safety lessons to reinforce this important message with the children. Please help us by modelling safe and considerate behaviour and by supporting the work of our crossing patrol team.

Together, we can make sure every child gets to and from school safely.

Walking Home from School and Collection Arrangements

We know that as children get older, families sometimes make different arrangements for journeys home from school – whether that's walking independently, being collected by an older sibling or going home with another trusted adult.

National guidance advises parents to carefully consider their child's age, maturity and ability to keep themselves safe before allowing them to travel without direct adult supervision.

Things to think about include:

- How familiar your child is with the route
- Road safety awareness and confidence in crossing safely
- What they would do if plans change or something goes wrong

Whether they know who is authorised to collect them

At Arno Vale, we usually only agree for children in **Year 6** to walk home alone/without direct adult supervision. If this applies to your child, you must inform the school office of the exact arrangements so that our records are accurate and up to date. Please also let us know straight away if anything changes. Irrespective of age, we do ask that all children are collected by an adult when it is dark (for example, if they stay behind for an after school club).

We will share further information and more detailed guidance with families later this term.

Uniform and PE kit Reminders

We expect all children to wear the correct school uniform. This helps create a sense of belonging, supports equality and ensures pupils are dressed appropriately for learning.

School Uniform

- Light blue polo shirt or shirt
- Navy blue sweatshirt, cardigan or fleece (these must be either Arno Vale branded or completely plain)
- Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress (or a blue and white checked summer dress in warmer weather)
 - Plain black school shoes

However, please note that items do not have to have the school logo as long as they are completely plain.

PE Kit

All children are expected to have the correct kit in school for PE lessons. This should be named and kept in a PE bag with a hanging loop so it can be placed on their peg.

- Plain white t-shirt
- Plain black or navy-blue bottoms (either shorts, skorts, leggings or joggers).
- Trainers. Ideally children should have an indoor pair and an outdoor pair. If this isn't possible, dirty trainers should be cleaned before being used for indoor PE.
 - Spare socks
- For outdoor PE, we also ask that they have a plain black or navy-blue zip up/hoodie (this must be different to the jumper they wear for school).

PE reminders

- Make sure you have your PE kit in school
- Get changed quietly in 5 minutes or less
 - Long hair should be tied back
- Jewellery (including watches) should be removed
 - Tights must not be worn under PE kit

Please ensure all items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name in order to minimise the amount of lost property around school.

A Little Request from School

As well as your support with uniform and PE kit, another way that you can really help us is by ensuring children don't bring "extras" into school. This includes bracelets and jewellery (an inexpensive watch is fine), teddy bears, fiddle toys, mini figures, plastic toys, sentimental or valuable items and similar things.

We promise this isn't us being grumpy — we simply want to avoid anything going missing and to keep classrooms free from unnecessary distractions. Please be assured that we will provide all the equipment your child needs for learning during the school day.

The only exception is on Mondays and Fridays, when children are welcome to bring in their trading cards for Trading Card Club.
