

Bulletin: Friday 21st November 2025 (website version)

This week began with an exciting buzz across the whole school as our Year 6 children put their leadership skills into action. Over the past few weeks, they have been working hard in their PE lessons to design, plan and organise a series of sports events for everyone to enjoy – and Monday morning was their moment to shine.

The Year 6 children were fantastic role models throughout, taking their responsibilities seriously and demonstrating real maturity. Their preparation and effort were evident in

every activity they led. Each class participated in a 30 minute session and the younger children were full of enthusiasm as they took part in the games and challenges on offer.

The event also helped to raise additional funds for Children in Need. We are very proud of the children for their commitment and leadership.

Our attention now turns to the Christmas Concert at St Mark's Church, Woodthorpe, which will take place on Tuesday 9th December. It is always a lovely, festive event and we hope that you can make it.

To help manage the crowd, and in light of another large attendance last year, it has been agreed that we can hold two performances again this year. The first performance will start at 10.00am and it will then be repeated at 2.00pm. We expect each performance to last for about 50 minutes.

# *Here are some key points to note:*

- Despite the fact that there will be two showings of the performance, we anticipate that church will still be very busy and there is a chance that there will only be standing room for some people. We do not allocate tickets. We kindly request that people only attend one of the shows in order to maximise opportunities for everyone.
- Please do not sit in the reserved seats at the front unless one has been specifically allocated to you.
- Parking is limited so if you are able to walk there, please do so. Please be mindful of local residents when parking.
  - Photos can be taken but please do not post anything on social media.
- Please ensure your child's coat has their name in. This will help us at the end when we are handing coats back to them.
  - Children may wear a santa hat to church if they want to.
- After the performances on Tuesday, we will ask you to leave the church first, keeping doors and pathways clear. That will give us the time and space required to get the children organised to return to school safely. Children will be dismissed from school as

normal at 3.35pm. For safeguarding reasons, they cannot be collected from the church.

• Please note that we will also be taking the children to the church for a full dress rehearsal the day before (Monday 8th December) in the afternoon.



# **General messages**

- From next week, you'll notice a change to how the children line up on the playground in the mornings. Y6 will now be lining up closest to the school building, followed by Y5, Y4 and then Y3. This is because Y5 and 6 have the furthest to walk so we want to ensure we are maximising learning time for all.
- We have been informed that the person who has been doing the crossing patrol job on Arno Vale Road has left their position. The road safety team will now be trying to recruit somebody to fill the vacancy. If you are interested, please get in touch and we can pass on your details.
- At Arno Vale, we usually only agree for children in **Year 6** to walk home alone/without direct adult supervision. If this applies to your child, you must inform the school office of the exact arrangements so that our records are accurate and up to date. Please also let us know straight away if anything changes. **Irrespective of age, we do ask**

# that all children are collected by an adult when it is dark (for example, if they stay behind for an after school club).

- Thank you to everyone who went to the book fair. We took over £1400 (the highest amount since 2005) which tipped us into the 55% commission bracket. This means we now have over £700 to spend on new books for the school library. This is such good news!
- Our new website is live <u>Arno Vale Junior School</u> and we are now in the process of ensuring it is all up to date as some sections did not transfer over exactly as intended.
- A message from Star Vision Photography: Please can you let all of your pupils' parents and carers know that they have until midnight on Sunday to take advantage of free shipping back to school on all photo orders. After this time there will be a price increase and all orders will be delivery to home only.
