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### ***A message from Mrs Blakemore about reading homework:***

*Reading for pleasure has many benefits. Not only does it lead to academic success, it can improve mental health, develop social skills, broaden horizons and improve creativity. It is important that all children develop their reading skills. We strongly encourage all children to read for at least 10 minutes most days.*

*At Arno Vale, we encourage all our pupils to read for pleasure. One of the ways we do this is by giving children free choice in the books they read; either from our school library, a local library or those they have at home. Reading does not have to be limited to stories in books. It can be listening to audiobooks, reading ebooks, blogs or information books. Listening to an adult read, and sharing stories together is a key motivator in reading for pleasure.*

*To further support those children accessing the Little Wandle Fluency Program, Switch On Reading or reading with our reading volunteers, we will be sending home a book from a colour band determined by the child's reading age. We ask that these are read with an adult and returned each week. The books will be changed each week during one of their reading sessions.*
