# If you missed this week's letter about Harvest, here it is:

You may have seen in our recent school bulletins that our annual Harvest Festival is taking place on Wednesday 8th October. As this is always such a popular and well-attended event, and space in the hall is limited, we will be holding two assemblies on the day:

- Morning Assembly: 9.15am start (arrival from 9.00am)
- Afternoon Assembly: 2.45pm start (arrival from 2.30pm)

Please note that the afternoon assembly is a repeat of the morning one, so we ask that you don't come to both. Each assembly will last for around 30 minutes and will include class presentations on the theme of food waste, some harvest songs and a contribution from a representative of St Mark's Church.

You do not need a ticket to attend but please be aware that it may feel a little busy and seating may be limited. We will also be collecting donations for Arnold Food Bank to help support families in our local community. If you are able to contribute, the following items are most needed:

- Tinned Meat/Meals (e.g. corned beef, ham, hotdogs, meatballs, minced beef, chicken in white sauce, etc.)
  - Pasta Sauce/Tinned Tomatoes
    - Tinned Tuna/Fish

- Jam and Spreads (e.g. chocolate spread, honey, peanut butter)
  - Tinned Fruit
- Tea and Coffee (particularly small 100g jars and packs of 40 teabags)
  - Razors, Deodorant, Sanitary Towels, Shampoo, Shower Gel
    - Chocolate Treats and Snacks, Biscuits, Crackers
      - Rice Pudding and Custard
  - Tinned Vegetables (especially peas, carrots, and sweetcorn)
    - Tinned Soup (especially tomato and chicken)
      - Noodles pots and pack

#### Roblox

"Steal A Brainrot" is a popular game on the Roblox platform that we know many of our children are currently playing at home. However, we are becoming increasingly aware that this particular game is proving tricky for some pupils to manage, particularly due to the nature of 'stealing' from other players. Some children have shared that they feel tricked or targeted by their peers in the game, and others have become quite upset when they have been 'stolen from'.

Unfortunately, the fallout from these online interactions has been spilling over into school life. A number of children have found it difficult to separate what happens in the game from real-life friendships and resolving issues related to the game has taken up a significant amount of learning time for both pupils and staff this week. This, in turn, has taken staff away from other duties and learning support.

Because of this, we feel it is important to let families know that Steal A Brainrot is not a game we would recommend at this time. As always, our advice to parents is to supervise children while they are online and to have regular conversations about what they are playing, who they are playing with and how the games make them feel.

# **Making Sense of Autism**

We are really lucky to be hosting two 'Making Sense of Autism' sessions for family members of autistic children. The sessions will be lead by the Communication and Interaction team from Nottinghamshire County Council, a team with whom we work closely in order to support children in the school. The team will share the most up-to-date thinking around autism, including latest research and support through a strength-based model.

These sessions are open to family members of children with a diagnosis or autism, or those whose families believe may be autistic. The aim of these sessions is to explore your child's strengths and support needs and encourage you to identify your child's individual profile of autism. Throughout the sessions, parents are encouraged to ask questions in the hope that parents learn from and support each other.

- Wednesday 5th November 14:30 to 15:30. Session 1: Social Understanding and Communication, Flexibility and Information Processing
  - Wednesday 7th January 14:30 to 15:30. Session 2 : Understanding Sensory
     Processing

If you feel these sessions will be helpful for your family, you are more than welcome to attend (tea and biscuits also provide). You can attend both or just one of the sessions. ### Club Vale - Childcare Vouchers

If you are paying for Breakfast or After-School Club using childcare vouchers, please note the following important information:

# **Booking deadlines**

- Booking forms must be submitted by **midnight on Thursday** for the following week.
  - You are welcome to book in advance for multiple weeks if this is easier.

### Club times

- **Breakfast Club:** 7:30am until the start of the school day.
- **After-School Club:** From the end of the school day until **5:30pm**.

• Please be aware that a late collection fee may apply to cover staff overtime costs.

## **Childcare voucher payments**

When you make a payment via your childcare voucher provider, there is an unavoidable delay before the funds appear on our system. This is because:

- 1. Voucher companies pay directly into the Trust's bank account.
  - 2. The Finance Team must process and report the payments.
- 3. The school office is notified only after these reports are complete.
- 4. The payments then undergo two further audit checks before they can be fully applied to your account.

Due to this process, accounts may temporarily show in arrears. Please don't worry—during this period, the school office will continue to make bookings on your behalf until the payment clears.
