#### Christmas concert

The Christmas Concert at St Mark's Church, Woodthorpe will take place on Tuesday 9th December. It is always a lovely, festive event and we hope that you can make it.

To help manage the crowd, and in light of another large attendance last year, it has been agreed that we can hold two performances again this year. The first performance will start at 10.00am and it will then be repeated at 2.00pm. We expect each performance to last for about 50 minutes.

Here are some key points to note:

• Despite the fact that there will be two showings of the performance, we anticipate that church will still be very busy and there is a chance that there will only be

standing room for some people. We do not allocate tickets. We kindly request that people only attend one of the shows in order to maximise opportunities for everyone.

- Please do not sit in the reserved seats at the front unless one has been specifically allocated to you.
- Parking is limited so if you are able to walk there, please do so. Please be mindful of local residents when parking.
  - Photos can be taken but please do not post anything on social media.
- Please ensure your child's coat has their name in. This will help us at the end when we are handing coats back to them.
  - Children may wear a santa hat to church if they want to.
- After the performances on Tuesday, we will ask you to leave the church first, keeping doors and pathways clear. That will give us the time and space required to get the children organised to return to school safely. Children will be dismissed from school as normal at 3.35pm. For safeguarding reasons, they cannot be collected from the church.
  - Please note that we will also be taking the children to the church for a full dress rehearsal the day before (Monday 8th December) in the afternoon.

# The importance of knowing times tables

Being confident with times tables is a key part of children's mathematical development.

Quick recall of multiplication facts helps children solve calculations more efficiently, supports their understanding of division, fractions and problem-solving and builds a strong foundation for the maths they will encounter in later years. When children know their times tables well, they can focus their thinking on new concepts rather than getting stuck on basic facts.

Parents can play a big role in helping children learn their times tables. Short, regular practice is far more effective than long sessions—just a few minutes a day can make a real difference. You might try using flashcards, chanting together, singing times-table songs or using online games such as Times Table Rock Stars. Practising in real-life situations also helps: counting objects in groups, talking about multiplication in cooking or shopping or asking quick-fire questions on the school run. Most importantly, keep it fun and positive—celebrating small improvements helps build confidence and motivation.
