Parent View


A big thank you to all the parents who took the time to complete the Parent View questionnaire — we had an amazing 93 responses!

We're very grateful for the positive feedback and some lovely comments about the work we're doing. Your support means a great deal to us.


Of course, we're always looking to improve, so we'll be carefully reviewing any constructive suggestions and considering what small tweaks we can make to enhance the experience for both children and families.




My child does well at school.



My child feels safe at Arno Vale Junior School.




My child has opportunities to take part in a range of clubs and activities at the school.



My child has SEND and the school takes all reasonable measures to give them the support they need.




My child has the opportunity to study a range of subjects as part of a broad and balanced curriculum.



My child is happy at Arno Vale Junior School.




The school has effective measures in place to promote good behaviour, and instances of misbehaviour are addressed appropriately.



The school has high expectations for my child.




The school has responded to any concerns I've raised in a timely, respectful and effective manner.



The school keeps me well-informed about what's happening (e.g. through weekly bulletins).




The school lets me know how my child is doing at relevant points throughout the year (e.g. at parents evenings).




