School Games Afternoon

In case you missed it, here is the information Miss Elliott sent out recently about School Games Afternoon, which is scheduled to take place next Thursday:

You are invited to attend our School Games afternoon, which is scheduled to take place on Thursday 19th June — weather permitting. The gate to the school field will be opened at 1.00pm, the event will last all afternoon, and normal home-time arrangements will be in place.

The afternoon will have two parts:

Part 1: Approximately 1.10pm - 2.35pm. A carousel of activities designed to showcase different aspects of the schools PE curriculum, Club / Competition opportunities and wider offer. As part of the carousel, classes will also be showcasing their dance skills. Dances will take place in the hall and seating will be available in front of the stage and in front of the apparatus, please speak with your child about where they want you to sit.

Part 2: Approximately 2.35pm - 3.20pm. Sprint races. Heats will have taken place during PE lessons and pupils who want to race on the day will be allocated a slot in a year group specific race.

Please ensure your child has their PE kit (plain white t-shirt), blue / black bottoms and trainers. We would encourage you to provide your child with a hat, sun-cream and a water bottle. Sun-glasses would be useful but are not essential.

Parent helpers will move from station to station with their child's class so will have a front row view of all the action. If you are available and willing to help please message Miss Elliott so she can co-ordinate all the arrangements.

In order to ensure pupils are fully prepared and to alleviate any pre-event jitters, all classes will be participating in a sports day dry run next Monday morning (16th June). Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school on Monday so they are able to participate in the practice session.

My name is Anna Purchase, and I attended Arno Vale from 2007 to 2011. I wanted to reach out to the school in the hope you can pass this message on to Mr Baker, who was my teacher in year 6.

Mr Baker,


I was going through my childhood memories in my grandma's attic and came across a note you wrote for me when I finished Year Six! It was an incredible find and made me feel very nostalgic. I remember how involved you were in sports and how much you encouraged us to stay active.

I wanted to reach out to let you know that I did, indeed, make it to Team GB. I ended up going to university in America on a sports scholarship for hammer throw - first at Nebraska, and then I transferred to the University of California, Berkeley. While I was there, I became the second British woman ever to throw over 70 meters in the women's hammer!


Since then, I've competed for Team England at the Commonwealth Games, twice at the European Championships - placing eighth in 2024 - and at the 2023 World Championships, where I made the final. Not only that, but the sport has taken me all over the world and brought the most amazing family and friends into my life!

I still remember the influence of the activities and sports we did at Arno Vale, and I truly believe it contributed to my love for athletics. My mother passed away in 2014, and sport was the one constant in my life. I just wanted to thank you for encouraging a younger me to keep going. I absolutely loved finding your note.
