#### Online safety

As you know, we place a strong emphasis on educating our children about responsible and appropriate use of digital devices. We appreciate that managing your child's online activity can be challenging, but regular checks of their devices are essential to ensure their safety and wellbeing. Many children may not yet fully understand the risks associated with online communication and it is our shared responsibility to guide them in developing safe and responsible habits.

At school, we take a proactive approach to online safety through:

- Regular online safety lessons as part of our curriculum, where children learn about privacy settings, the impact of their digital footprint and the consequences of inappropriate online behaviour.
  - Discussions on cyberbullying and online conduct, helping children understand the importance of respectful communication and the potential dangers of social media and messaging apps.
    - Assemblies to reinforce the importance of staying safe online.
- Constantly encouraging children to talk to a trusted adult if they encounter anything that makes them uncomfortable.

To support this work at home, we strongly encourage you to:

- Regularly check your child's device, including messages, apps and social media accounts.
  - Set appropriate screen time limits to ensure they are getting enough rest.
- Discuss with them the importance of respectful online communication and the risks of latenight messaging.
  - Encourage open conversations about any concerns they may have regarding their online interactions.
