I am delighted to share the fantastic work our class ambassadors have been doing to improve our playground and playtimes. They have conducted research across all classes, gathering insights on what children love about playtimes, what challenges they face and how we can make them even better.

After careful discussion and ranking of ideas, the ambassadors have put forward five key priorities:

- 1. **More balls** Dedicated playground balls separate from PE equipment, along with easy-to-use pumps.
- 2. **More outdoor games and equipment** Refreshing old chess and Connect 4 sets, plus additional skipping ropes and other activities.
 - 3. **An indoor club** A quiet space with board games, colouring supplies and activities for those who prefer to stay inside sometimes.
 - 4. **Basketball improvements** Installing permanent wall-mounted hoops instead of fragile stand-alone posts.
 - 5. **Clear playground zones** Reintroducing designated play areas to ensure everyone has space to enjoy different activities.

To make this happen, the ambassadors have been granted a significant budget from FOAV's fundraising efforts. They are eager to work together to choose the best equipment and make playtimes even more enjoyable for all.

I want to take this opportunity to extend a huge thank you to FOAV and everyone who has contributed to fundraising. Your generosity has already funded a VR headset experience, a theatre group visit, new climbing holds, a magician, skipping sessions and transport to the pantomime. This year, FOAV has already committed to further exciting projects including trim trail repairs, another theatre visit, anti-racism workshops for the whole school and another VR headset experience.

Your support makes a real difference in enhancing the school experience for every child and we are incredibly grateful.

In today's assembly, Iris gave a wonderful speech about her celebrations, sharing insights into Chinese customs and the traditions that bring families together during this time.





Sports news
