Our other girls team went away to All Hallows to play in their first ever match. Mr Hill and Mr King were full of praise for how much determination they showed.


Both boys teams have also been in action this week: a 3-1 win against Hawthorne and a 3-0 win against Good Shepherd.

## Reminders from previous bulletins:

#### **Nut Free Site**

To ensure the safety of all our children and staff, please do not send any items containing nuts to school. This includes snacks, packed lunches and birthday treats. Even trace amounts of nuts can cause severe allergic reactions in some children, so your cooperation is essential in keeping our school a safe environment for everyone.

#### Free School Meals

Transitional Protection for Free School Meals is changing. Here is the current update we have from the council regarding what this means for families:

- Any child currently eligible for free school meals under transitional protection will
  continue to be eligible for free school meals until the end of their current phase of
  education, for example children in year 1 will continue to be eligible until they leave
  primary school in year 6.
  - Any child who becomes eligible for free school meals up to 31 March 2025 will continue to be eligible for free school meals until the end of their current phase of education, for example children in year 1 will continue to be eligible until they leave primary school in year 6.
- Any child who becomes eligible for free school meals on or after 1 April 2025 will be
  eligible for free school meals but will be assessed regularly and if there is a change in
  their circumstances and they no longer receive a qualifying benefit, they will lose
  entitlement to free school meals.

The cost is £13 for the full term, which includes a slice of buttered toast and a carton of milkshake. Please make payment by **Sunday**, **20th April** to allow the kitchen to cater for everyone.

## Recycling

You may be aware that from the beginning of this week, new recycling legislation came into force that affects most businesses and organisations such as schools. It is called the 'Simpler Recycling' initiative and its aim is to reduce the amount of waste we, as a nation, send to landfill and to encourage more reusing and recycling. Organisations are required to separate their food waste from other refuse and place it in a separate bin for disposal.

We held an assembly at the start of the week to explain this to the children and to inform them of what they need to do at lunchtimes. Children who stay for a school meal will place their food waste into a bin in the hall at the end of their meal. This waste has to be separate from any other type of waste including packaging.

We are asking the children who bring a packed lunch to put any of their waste back into their lunchboxes and take it home. This allows you to see what your child has eaten, what they have left and can encourage discussions around what they like to have for lunch. We have compost bins in school and any fruit or vegetable left overs from snack time (for example apple cores, orange or banana peel) can be deposited in a designated bin ready to be emptied into the compost bins.

After the Easter break, we will be working with the children to look at how we are managing our waste across the school to see what improvements we can make to be as environmentally friendly as we can.
