Research shows that acts of kindness—whether given, received, or even observed—release feel-good hormones that boost our mood, reduce stress and even promote better heart health.

Stop Hate UK, based in Leeds, is dedicated to raising awareness of discrimination and hate crime, encouraging its reporting and supporting those affected. This has very kindly been funded by FOAV's fundraising efforts.


Nathaniel and Leon showed us their Player of the Match trophies from football.
