Staffing

I am really pleased to inform you that Mrs Morley and Miss Oates have been appointed substantive SENCOs (Special Educational Needs Coordinators) from the start of the spring term. They have both been covering the role in an acting capacity and have been working incredibly hard to ensure that we are providing the best we can for children with special educational needs. They will be carrying out the role on a job share basis.

We have also appointed Mrs Natalie Wright as our PE / Sport Specialist teacher. Each school in the country receives a Sport Premium grant with the objective of increasing children's participation in sport, ensuring class teachers are kept up to date with their PE training and children have opportunities to take part in competitive sport. Schools can choose how they spend this money and we are using it to employ a specialist teacher. The children are very familiar with Mrs Wright as she has been carrying out the role on a contractual basis for one day per week. The increase in funding that was announced by the Government in October means that we can now employ her directly for two days per week starting in January.

As you know, we welcome both Miss Oates and Mrs Baker back to school in January following their maternity leave. Miss Oates will be teaching alongside Mrs Morley and Mrs Baker alongside Mrs Fearn.
