Hi,

I am the local PCSO that covers your school, just wanted to get in contact with you all to let you know a couple of things.

We are getting more and more complaints about badly parked vehicles at school drop off and pick up times. I know this is an issue all over and it's something I don't think we will ever stop. But can we make sure that we are all doing as much as we can to prevent the badly parked vehicles. There are complaints that peoples driveways are getting blocked, double parking so larger vehicles can't even get down the smaller roads, parking on junctions and completely blocking pathways. I am going to do my upmost to be patrolling the schools at these times and I will be putting warning leaflets on the badly parked cars. Obviously I can't be at every school, every day. Is there any chance you could send out a letter just reinforcing and reminding parents to make sure they are being considerate when they are parking? If the bad parking continues after some warning leaflets have been issued then I will be bringing a Police Officer with me and they have the power to issue tickets to vehicles that are causing an obstruction.
