Europe is one of the world's seven continents.

Europe is the second smallest continent.

Europe is made up of 44 countries

European capital cities:

Industrial regions produce goods which can be bought and sold in the country. Selling internationally is called exporting.

France has a variety of landscapes, there is the **Alps** mountains (including Mont Blanc, the highest mountain in Western Europe) and the **Pyrenees**.

Rivers: The Seine, Loire, Rhône, and Garonne.

Coasts: Long coastlines along the Atlantic Ocean and the Mediterranean Sea.



## The Geography of Europe and France

### Vocabulary:

Continent	The world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica).
Country	A nation with its own government occupying a specific area.
Developing country	A country which has a lower quality of life. It often has a lower life expectancy and poor sanitation.
Developed country	A country which has a higher quality of life. It has a higher life expectancy and better sanitation.
EU	European Union.
Capital city	The city with the seat of government.
Industrial region	An area of a country with dense industry and manufacturing.
Port	A landing place for ships on a coast, river, or lake. Ships dock at ports to load and unload their cargo and passengers.
Human features	<b>Human features</b> are parts of a place that people have made. They wouldn't exist without humans building or changing something.
Physical features	<b>Physical features</b> are parts of a place that are natural. They are made by <b>nature</b> , not by humans.
