| Continent | The world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica). |
| Country | A nation with its own government occupying a specific area. |
| Developing country | A country which has a lower quality of life It often has a lower life expectancy and poor sanitation. |
| Developed country | A country which has a higher quality of life. It has a higher life expectancy and better sanitation. |
| EU | European Union. |
| Capital city | The city with the seat of government. |
| Industrial region | An area of a country with dense industry and manufacturing. |
| Port | A landing place for ships on a coast, river, or lake. Ships dock at ports to load and unload their cargo and passengers. |
| Human features | Human features are parts of a place that people have made . They wouldn't exist without humans building or changing something. |
| Physical features | Physical features are parts of a place that are natural . They are made by nature , not by humans. |
