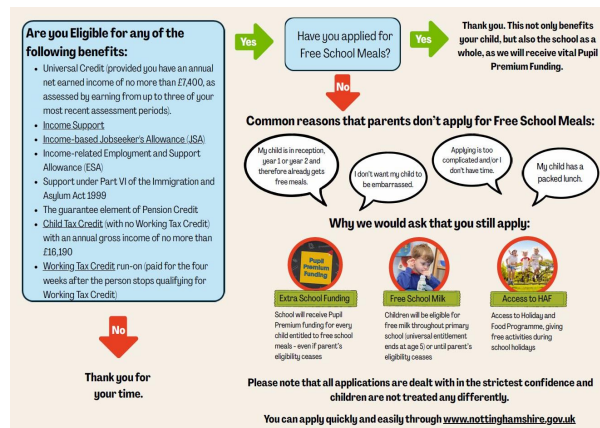

Mobile Phones in School



A quick reminder that we have a no phones in school policy for children. They should not be bringing phones to school and if they do, it will be sent to the office and an adult will be

asked to collect them. When used unsupervised, mobiles can lead to safeguarding concerns, unwanted photo taking and unkind messages. Please don't feel you need buy your child a phone, as it won't be allowed in school. You can see the policy in more detail by clicking this [link Link to policy](#).

Changes to Catering and Free School Meals



National changes to Free School Meals (FSM) eligibility have taken place. One of the biggest updates is that families receiving Universal Credit may now qualify for FSM even if your income is above £7.400 per year.

Children in Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2 will continue to receive FSM automatically.
Checking your eligibility for FSM also checks your child's eligibility to receive pupil premium funding that supports your child's school. So even if your child is in Foundation, Year 1 or Year 2, it is important you still apply if you think you may be entitled. Applications for FSM can currently be made through Nottinghamshire County Council's Citizen Portal by following [Free School Meals](#).

Don't forget that if your child is moving from Year 2 into Year 3 in September their entitlement to Universal Infant Free School Meals will come to an end. Therefore you will need to pay £3.16 for each meal unless you provide a packed lunch or are entitled to Income Based Free School Meals (FSM) - you can check your eligibilty via the Nottinghamshire County Council link above.

Just a polite reminder that school dinners should be paid in advance via MCAS (My Child at School). Don't forget to add some money to your child's dinner money account ahead of the new academic year.



Catering in School

From September we will have a new catering supplier, Aspens. Although the kitchen staff will remain the same, we will have new food, menus and systems.

Aspens comply with the Food Information Regulation 2014 which states that allergen information must be provided for all food prepared and sold, and as such will provide a meal for your child if they have a special dietary requirement.

*Unfortunately as a new provider, **ALL ALLERGEN INFORMATION NEEDS TO BE RESUBMITTED** for your child receive allergen appropriate menu.*

If your child does have a special dietary requirement you will need to complete and return a form please. (this was emailed home earlier in the week). Please ask the office to send a hard copy home if required.

If your child has a food allergy resulting in a severe reaction/anaphylactic shock, please speak to the school office so that Aspens can get in contact directly to discuss a suitable menu. If this allergy is to one of the known 14 allergens (celery, cereals containing gluten, crustaceans, egg, fish, lupin, milk, molluscs, mustard, peanuts, sesame, soybeans, sulphur dioxide, tree nuts.) then your child can be fed from our allergy aware menu until they have agreed a suitable menu with you.

If your child has multiple allergies or is allergic to other foods such as tomatoes, please could you provide a packed lunch for them until Aspens have met with you to agree a suitable menu.

For those children with intolerance and lifestyle choices, please follow our usual ordering system and select from the daily menu.

Key Stage 2 Music Lessons



In the new academic year Key Stage 2 children have the opportunity to take music lessons with one of our external music teachers.

At the moment, I would just like to get an idea of interest and numbers of Key Stage 2 pupils, who would like to take lessons (we can offer a taster session prior to final sign up). Taster session details will be finalised in early September and information sent home.

Key information

- *Lessons will be ongoing throughout the school year.*
- *Lessons will take place during the school day (your child will miss part of a regular lesson, break or lunchtime).*
- *Fees will be paid directly to the external music provider (in advance), not to the school.*

- Children that signed up for guitar or piano this current academic year will be able to continue if they wish.
 - Please note that places are limited so we cannot guarantee your child will be successful should they apply for lessons.
 - Pupils may only sign up for guitar OR piano during school time (not both).

There are a limited number of **guitar lesson** slots available on a Tuesday that are being offered to children who will be in class 2a, 2b, 2c, 2d, 2e and 2f in the next academic year.

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- Each weekly lesson will be 30 minutes long.
 - Lessons are £24.25 - fees are invoiced on a termly basis (5-7 weeks)
 - There is a one-off joining fee of £6.85.
 - Students may borrow a guitar or bring their own.

If your key stage 2 child is interested in signing up for a guitar music taster session please complete the expression of interest form ([link here](#)) and we will pass your details to Create Music, the music provider.

Create Music will also be sending home some information flyers on 21st July following the guitar assembly.



Piano lesson slots are fully booked and there is a waiting list.

If your child is in 2a, 2b, 2c, 2d, 2e or 2F in the next academic year and would like to be added to the piano waiting list please complete the expression of interest form ([link here](#)) and we will pass your details to Mrs Fisher the music provider.

Breakfast Clubs



Thank you for supporting our Breakfast Clubs .

Polite reminder that both the 30-minute free Breakfast Club and the Arnie's Breakfast Club sessions need to be booked in advance/before the session starts on the day please (via 'My Child at School' (MCAS).

Arnie's Wraparound Care Breakfast Club (children may sign in any time between 7.45am & 8.30am):

-
- **7.45am** – doors open (entry will not be permitted before 7.45am)
 - **7.45am – 8.30am** - entry via the Library. Each child will be registered as they arrive.
 - **7.45am – 8.40am** - Breakfast is served (breakfast of the day and a drink)
 - **7.45am -8.50am** – children have the opportunity to socialise with their friends, play games, read or do art/craft.
 - **8.30am** - a 'Wake and Shake' activity in the Hall starts and is open to children from both Breakfast Clubs.
 - **8.50am** - the children line up in readiness to be escorted to their classrooms for class registration at 9.00am.

Arnie's Breakfast Club is available for children in Nursery to Year 6 and is £3.50 per session and should be booked and paid in advance via MCAS (My Child at School).

Year 5 & 6 children that have permission to walk to school independently may sign themselves in to Breakfast Club, all other children must be accompanied by a parent/guardian to ensure a safe handover.

Payments can also be made by childcare voucher, don't forget to send the relevant paperwork to the office so that they can match up the payment with your account - it may take a few working days for your account to sync.

Arnold Mill's Free Breakfast Club (children to arrive in time for the 8.30am sign in please):

- **8.30am Registration** - please arrive at the Library entrance in time for the 8.30am Registration (entry will not be permitted before 8.30am)

- **8.40am Late Registration closes** - anyone arriving after 8.40am or not booked on the session may be refused entry and redirected to wait at the classroom door to open at 8.50am.
 - **8.30am - 8.40am** - Breakfast is served (toast with jam or butter & a drink)
 - **8.30 -8.50am** – children have the opportunity to socialise with their friends, play games, read or do art/craft.
 - **8.30am** - a 'Wake and Shake' activity in the Hall starts and is open to children from both Breakfast Clubs.
 - **8.50am** - the children begin to collect their things and line up in readiness to be escorted to their classrooms for class registration at 9.00am.

The 30-minute breakfast club is available for children in Reception (F2) to Year 6 (not Nursery).

Year 5 & 6 children that have permission to walk to school independently may sign themselves in to Breakfast Club, all other children must be accompanied by a parent/guardian to ensure a safe handover.

General Safety Information

- *Classroom doors open at 8.50am, parents/carers are welcome to come on to site from 8.45am but please ensure that your children are supervised at all times.*
 - *For insurance purposes please do not allow your children to play on the trim trail or other outdoor equipment at drop off/pick up times.*
 - *We have noticed an increasing number of unsupervised children arriving early on site, whilst we love it that they are keen to be in school as there are no members of staff outside we will take them to Breakfast Club (we reserve the right to charge for the Breakfast Club place)*

If you have any questions, please contact the school office in the first instance.

Not only is storing and recycling batteries safely great for the environment, it can also help reduce risks associated with batteries: Batteries can cause serious injury or death if swallowed, please keep batteries out of reach of small children and pets. Lithium and button batteries need to be taped so their contacts don't touch, as they could short circuit if they do.

Use sticky tape over the contacts (top and bottom of batteries). Button batteries can be placed in a line between two sections of sticky tape. Lithium batteries can look like any battery, but they will have lithium (Li) written on them.





Batteries list

Batteries we CAN accept:

We are collecting common household batteries:

- AAA, AA, C, D, 9V and button batteries

Any batteries marked with the word lithium (Li) should have their contacts (e.g. top and tail) taped over.

Batteries we CANNOT accept:

- Damaged or leaking batteries
- Very dirty batteries
- Car Batteries
- Industrial Batteries
- Batteries with connecting wires (unless taped to the side of the battery)

Although we're not asking for them, we will collect things like: mobile phone and similar device specific batteries, as well as laptop and power tool batteries, if they are put in your collection box.

Safety First:

Batteries can cause serious injury or death if swallowed, please keep batteries out of the reach of small children and pets.

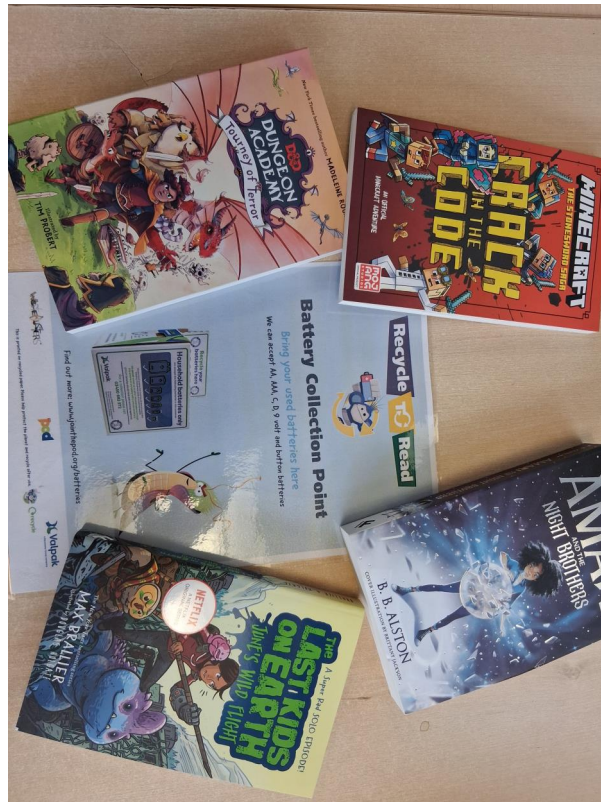
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Sun Protection Guidelines – Sun Hats and Sun Cream



Now that the warm weather has arrived I would like to remind parents/carers of our sun protection guidance.

On hot days we will encourage children to wear a hat, drink plenty of water and sit in the shade as required.

- Please make sure your child brings a sun hat/cap and water bottle (marked with their name and class) to school*
 - Please ensure that your child is wearing suitable school shoes (no trainers, flip flops, crocs or open toed shoes)*
 - **Please apply sun cream to your child before they come to school on hot days. The long lasting protection types are recommended.** If your child is prone to burning and you feel they may need an additional application you may send in a bottle of sun cream (marked with their name), which your child should give to their teacher. Your child will be able to apply the cream themselves when needed (usually just before lunchtime) under the supervision of a classroom staff member.*

If your child requires a staff member to assist with applying additional sun cream please email the class teacher to confirm that you give consent for a member of staff to assist your child to apply an additional application of the sun cream you have/will provide.
